### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK



And so we come to Palm Sunday and commencement of Holy Week, which marks not

only the climax of the Lenten season but also the high point of the Church year. Today we have two Gospels rather than just one. Given that The Gospel of Mark has been described as 'a passion narrative with a long introduction and our second Gospel to be read today is Mark's account of the Passion of our Lord, then all too often our first Gospel is overlooked.

This is a great pity since Jesus deliberately acts out a passage from the Old Testament as he enters Jerusalem at the commencement of this momentous week, 'Shout with gladness' Jerusalem your king comes to you; humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey' (Zechariah 9:9). If Jesus has gone to the trouble of acting out this ancient passage, then it must be significant enough for us to seriously consider and reflect upon.

Jesus had visited Jerusalem on other occasions, but not like this. Only last Friday during our station Mass at St Matthieu we heard of Jesus going to Jerusalem in private, because he did not wish to draw attention to himself. But now in this triumphal entry into Jerusalem He receives the acclamation of the crowd and shows that He is their longed for King, The Messiah. However, in choosing to act out this passage, Jesus demonstrates how his Kingship is different to the popular understanding, for He is a humble servant King. Humbler even to accepting death, death on a cross, the most brutal punishment and abject humiliation possible.

But actually both of our Gospels show Jesus as King. His death upon the cross was not a defeat and humiliation but victory over the powers of sin and death. The cross, a symbol of oppression, becomes the ultimate sign of God's love for us and also teaches us how we should seek to live by seeking to follow lives of humble service in accordance with the will of God. As we enter into Holy Week it would do us all no harm to consider and reflect whether we have followed the lead and example of our King, the humble servant.
