## THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

which upset a parent so much that they wrote a letter of complaint to the Head teacher. The quiz questions included:

*What was the title of the men who visited Jesus in Matthew's account of the birth?*

*How many of them were there?*

*In what type of building did they find Jesus?*

The man's daughter answered that they were Kings, there were three of them and they found Jesus in a stable. Apparently I was responsible for "*St Thomas Aquinas turning in his grave*" as I gave his daughter no marks whatsoever for those three answers.

Summoned to the Head teacher's office to explain myself, I surprised the parent and equally the Head teacher, as I pointed out that the passage we have as our Gospel reading for this weekend actually tells us that they were *wise men*, there were *some* of them and they went into a *house* to see the child. The pages of Sacred Scripture are full of surprises!

Like those wise men we also need to be guided to the person of Jesus. Having caused so much upset with my quiz, I never did dare to introduce *the story of the fourth wise man*. It's a nineteenth century tale about a man

called Artaban. He also saw the star that guided his colleagues to Jesus and set out to join them with his three gifts. He missed meeting his colleagues because he stopped to help a dying man. He had to sell one of his gifts so he had supplies for his lone journey. Travelling alone he arrived in Bethlehem much later than the others and after Jesus, Mary and Joseph had fled to Egypt. However, he saved the life of an infant by giving another of the gifts to a soldier tasked with carrying out the massacre of the Holy Innocents.

After many years of searching, fearing his own death was approaching, he used his final gift to pay the debt of a woman about to be sold into slavery. Distraught that he had never found Jesus he drifted into his final sleep and heard the words "*whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.*"

The great feast of the Epiphany, which we celebrate this weekend, reminds us that we are also on a journey to bring us ever closer to Jesus. We should also be prepared for a few surprises as to where that journey may lead us, just like the parent, Head teacher and the wise men... all four of them!

## SAINT FOR THE WEEK

### St Dermot: 10 January

In 6<sup>th</sup> century Ireland he was famed for being a good writer, poet and preacher. Wishing to get away from the distractions of daily life he took himself off to the island in Lough Ree. He was soon joined by many 'devotees' wishing to share his solitude! Rather than send them away he organised them into forming a community. They nicknamed him 'Dermot the Just' so fair was his leadership. Together they built seven churches on the island, the remains of six survive. His monastic school lasted six centuries after his death. He died on his island on 10 January 542.
